

Mission Statement

I am Distinguished Professor of Atmospheric Sciences and Associate Dean of College of Science at National Taiwan University. I obtained my Ph. D. from Massachusetts Institute of Technology in 1993, and worked as a post doctor at Princeton University in 1993-1995. Afterwards I joined the faculty position at the Department of Atmospheric Sciences, National Taiwan University. I have participated in all AOGS meetings in recent 7 years and have actively convened sessions in the AS section. My research focuses on tropical cyclones dynamics involving theories, observations, and numerical simulations. I served as the President of AS section in AOGS during 2009-2013, then as the Assistant Secretary General since 2013. In 2011, I was on the Local Advisory Committee and helped organize the AOGS 8th Annual Meeting in Taipei. While AOGS is gaining more momentum and receiving higher reputation on the world stage, it is my honor to contribute my experience and know-how to help bring AOGS to the next level, in particular in assisting AOGS to promote scientific collaboration and interaction, develop links with other geosciences organizations, and bring better opportunities to geoscientists throughout Asia and Oceania.
