Dr. Huffman focuses on the design, implementation, and extension of combined estimates of global precipitation, seeking to incorporate all available precipitation-relevant satellite and global surface data. He is the Deputy Project Scientist for the Global Precipitation Measurement (GPM) mission, the Chair of the GPM Multi-satellite Algorithm Working Group, and Chief of the Mesoscale Atmospheric Processes Lab.
