08:30 Depart from Hakata Station

Meet the guide at the designated meeting point.

09:45 Yamada Weir and Asakura Triple Waterwheel (90 min)

Yamada weir is made at end of 18th century. In 1990, a weir is made by Japanese doctor, Tetsu Nakamura at Marwarid Canal, Kunal River, Afganistan, this weir is modeled after the Yamada Weir. Experience Japan's oldest working triple waterwheels, where ancestral wisdom meets idyllic scenery in a powerful, historic landscape.

11:30 Lunch at Roppokan Hotel (60 min)

Enjoy Japanese Lunch Course at Roppokan Hotel

12:45 Akatani River in Asakura City (passby)

Witness the Akatani River from the bus, now fully restored as a symbol of recovery following the 2017 torrential rains in Asakura.

13:15 Koishiwara Tsuzumi (passby)

13:30 Koishiwara Pottery Exhibition Hall (60min)

Explore the central showroom, co-managed by ten local kilns, featuring an extensive collection of authentic Koishiwara-yaki pottery.



15:00 Egawa Dam, Terauchi Dam (60min)

Visit two major dams to appreciate their grand scale and vital role in regional water management.

17:30 Suitengu Shrine (45min)

Visit Kurume Suitengu Shrine, a profound heritage site symbolizing the deep spiritual connection between people and water.

19:15 Arrive at Hakata Station
