Industry-Academia Interaction

Academia-industry Collaboration has always been a topic of discussion, both between the Researchers as well as the Industry (manufacturer/ service provider). I feel, to convert these types of Academia-industry Collaborations into successful ventures, forums, where R&D institutes, colleges and universities that work towards a common goal to innovate processes and produce good and beneficial technologies for the industry to implement viably, are organized frequently.
