After receiving B.S. and M.S. in igneous petrology from Seoul National University, he was trained and received Ph.D. degree from University of California Santa Barbara on isotopic study of old alkalic rock in the Canadian Shield and its inferences on the geochemical and structural evolution of the mantle. His research interests include evolution of igneous activities in East Asia, geochemical evolution of the mantle beneath East Asia, and crustal growth. Since 1989, he has been faculty member of Department of Earth System Sciences, Yonsei University. He served a department chair from 1993 to 1995. He is currently serving as the president (2007-2008) of Petrological Society of Korea. He was awarded from Geological Society of Korea and Petrological Society of Korea.
