Pinxian WANG

Pinxian Wang graduated from Moscow State University in 1960. He is now a Professor at Tongji University, where he is the founding director of the Department and State Key Laboratory of Marine Geology. His research interests include the paleoceanography, micropaleontology and paleo-monsoon in East Asia, especially in the South China Sea. He was the co-chief scientist of the Ocean Drilling Program Leg 184 in 1999 and the Marco Polo Cruise in 2005, both to the South China Sea. He initiated the "Asian Marine Geology Conference" in 1988, and led the international working groups on paleo-monsoons. Currently he is leading a major research program "The South China Sea Deep" funded by the NSF-China. Prof. Wang has been serving on many national and international committees such as the Vice-President of the Scientific Committee on Ocean Research in 1994-1998. Prof. Wang is an honorary member of the London Geology Society and member of the Chinese Academy of Sciences since 1991.
