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Adam Switzer is a coastal scientist with interests in coastal geomorphology and natural hazards. Adam was a National Research Foundation (NRF) Singapore Fellow (2010-2015) and Nanyang Assistant Professor in the new Asian School of the Environment at Nanyang Technological University (NTU) and Principal Investigator at the Earth Observatory of Singapore (EOS). He uses interdisciplinary techniques to solve contemporary coastal problems at local, regional and international scales.
