

"The Legacy of the Cassini-Huygens Mission"

Had you ever wondered what lies across the horizon when you stand on the shore of the Malacca Straits? Of course, you had. And for sure, you would have expected to find mountains beyond mountains, and seas after seas. But do you know where the most distant mountains and farthest seas in the solar system? You can find them on Titan, the largest moon of Saturn. Their discoveries were made by the Cassini-Huygens project which was a NASA-ESA cooperative mission.

NASA has just approved a new mission called "Dragonfly" to send a robotic rotocraft lander to Titan. This means that some of you could have the chance to participate in this exciting mission.
